Wong Mei Ting embarked on her teaching career in 2012 and has since become a pioneer in e-Pedagogy and AI-enhanced teaching at Anderson Primary School. Her innovative approaches have transformed Chinese Language (CL) education and inspired educators nationwide.

In 2024, she developed Primary 5 and 6 oral learning packages, leveraging the latest Student Learning Space (SLS) functions and strategies such as "TREES" and "Three Watch." These resources enhanced interactivity, boosted student motivation, and significantly improved oral proficiency. She also led the integration of artificial intelligence tools like the Singapore Student Learning Space and Curipod in comprehension teaching, employing the "HAT" framework to provide dynamic feedback and real-time assessments. Her expertise was recognised at the CL-ICT sharing conducted by Singapore Centre for Chinese Language, where her contributions to classroom engagement were widely acclaimed.

Her leadership in AI-driven pedagogy was further highlighted in *The Straits Times* article, "How AI is Helping Teachers Create Engaging Learning Experiences in the Classroom". Her students have excelled in competitions, securing silver and bronze awards in the National CL Text Recital Competition, as well as bronze awards in both the Singapore and international categories of the International CL Creative Writing Competition.

Beyond the classroom, she collaborated with the Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre (SCCC) and the Character and Citizenship Education Department to co-curate the CL Travelling Exhibition "Unlock Festival" and incorporate cultural themes into Racial Harmony Day celebrations, enriching students' appreciation of heritage and diversity. Actively involved in professional development, she participates in Learning Journeys to exchange best practices and completed the MOE Teacher Leadership Programme (TLP) in 2024.

Her dedication has been recognised through multiple accolades, including the MSEA Silver Awards (2023, 2024), the Academic Award for Professional Development (AST Award – 2023), and three Outstanding Youth Educator Award (OYEA) nominations (2018, 2019, 2021). She has also been nominated for the MOE Instructional Mentorship Programme (IMP) 2025.
