Brother Yong Quan was also a presenter at the NTUC Labour Research Conference 2022 for the topic 'Power to Participate: Building Young Voices, Choices, and Experiences', where he shared insights about Young NTUC's initiatives supporting youths' career pursuits. Internationally, Brother Yong Quan represented NTUC at the 5th ITUC-AP Regional Conference, contributing to the rich discussions with international counterparts. Collaborating with Young NTUC, he hosted youth delegates from Asia Pacific attending the ITUC AP Youth Leadership Course in 2022 and 2023, where he shared about Singapore's tripartism model and his experiences as a union leader.

Brother Yong Quan played a vital role in fostering collaboration and strengthening the relationship between Young NTUC and Young PAP. Through knowledge-sharing sessions and joint initiatives, such as organising an Amazing Race event to commemorate Mr Lee Kuan Yew's birth anniversary, he contributed significantly to building bridges between the two organisations. Beyond his unionist role, Brother Yong Quan is a staunch advocate of mental well-being in the workplace. As a trained WSQ Certified Peer Supporter, he actively represents Young NTUC in discussions and dialogues about mental well-being.
