A prolific scholar with a stellar reputation, Sister Sun Sun has extensively researched the social impact of technology, focusing on technology domestication by families, future of work and AI ethics.

Furthermore, she collaborated with NTUC on national research projects and international publications, focusing on topics such as organising workers through digital means and technology adoption.

These projects have yielded valuable insights, offering strategies and recommendations to strengthen the Labour Movement's engagement with workers, while looking to improve workers' wages, welfare, and work prospects. She has also pushed for the representation of women in tech to ensure greater gender diversity in this key industry sector. Sister Sun Sun has also raised awareness of such issues through her active public engagement via her extensive body of media commentaries and interviews with local and international media.

In addition to her research contributions, she has strengthened the collaboration between the Singapore Management University (SMU) and NTUC, with her teams at SMU supporting NTUC's youth engagement efforts and innovation initiatives through SMU-X.
