Nur Akidah Ramad's journey with Young NTUC started in 2019 when she served in the seventh term of the Young NTUC Committee. Though relatively new to the Labour Movement, she volunteered as an exhibition guide at ReUnion, an exhibition by NTUC commemorating 50 years of its modernisation journey. Through the event, Sister Akidah familiarised herself with the content to introduce the Labour Movement through her eyes to the visitors.

Over the years, her passion for being a voice for young workers was evident through her various contributions. Her fellow young leaders duly chose her as the current ninth-term Young NTUC Service Sector Co-Chairperson. She rallies young leaders, initiates activities to strengthen their bonds, and brainstorms ideas to reach out to more young working people.

Sister Akidah has been representing Young NTUC on national-level platforms, including a dialogue with President Halimah Yacob in March 2022. On the international front, she represented Young NTUC on programmes such as the ITUC-Asia Pacific Youth Leadership Course and the 17th International Labour Organization Asia and the Pacific Regional Meeting (APRM) in 2022. She built international solidarity with overseas unionists and shared about the Singapore trade union movement. She has also contributed to the symbiosis between Young NTUC and Young PAP (People's Action Party). Besides participating in Young PAP dialogues and events, she facilitated a discussion during Young PAP's bi-monthly dialogue on strengthening mental well-being support.

Walking the talk, she is a trained peer supporter under Young NTUC's WSQ-certified training in peer-to-peer mental well-being support at work. In January 2023, she attended the Malay Affairs Bureau Retreat organised by PAP to provide perspectives of a young unionist.
