

HSEU Membership Launch 2009



HSEU held its annual Membership Launch for 2009 on 17 January 2009 at DXO (Esplanade Colours By The Bay). Under the theme "Celebrations!", the event was filled with fun-filled activities such as liveband performance, magic show, stage games, lucky draw and many more.

NTUC Deputy Secretary-General and Member of Parliament for Jurong GRC Madam Halimah Yacob, was present to witness the launch. For the first time, management partners also joined in the union's membership celebrations. From 1 February 2008 to 30 November 2008, a \$5 NTUC Voucher is given for each new HSEU member who joins during this period, with successful GIRO.

When asked about what HSEU will be embarking on to develop its membership base for 2009, HSEU Deputy General Secretary Janet Khoo, who heads the Union's membership committee, said: "Healthcare Services Employees' Union already has 13 branches with 13,800 members, and aims to bring in another 3,000 members this year. We will be approaching private healthcare institutions, community hospitals, nursing homes and clinics."

The Union will also extended its reach to educational institutions like Nanyang Polytechnic and Ngee Ann Polytechnic – both strong in nursing courses, to invite graduating students to join the Union as soon as they start work. Strong Labour-Management Relations have made it possible for HSEU's recruitment drives to run alongside with orientation programmes for new hires in the hospitals. "The opening of the Khoo Teck Puat Hospital in early 2010 also promises some membership boost for us," said HSEU General Secretary Diana Chia. HSEU aims to reach 20,000 members by 2011.

HSEU will up its Care and Share efforts this year to help members and their families cope with the financial crisis. Beyond current welfare schemes, it will also administer hardship grants for needy families which need that extra assistance.



"Healthcare jobs may not be at stake, but behind every healthcare worker, there is a family. Family members may be affected by job loss or wage cuts and this is where union membership will come in useful, with Care and Share initiatives that will help them tide over," added Miss Chia.

Madam Mastan Nachiyal Mohd, 45, is one of HSEU's certified recruiters who underwent a one-day in-house course. Training and her passion for serving people had her recruiting 176 new members in 2008 and emerging as top recruiter. Top Recruiters Awards and Best Recruiting Branch Awards for 2008 were given out at the HSEU Membership Launch on 17 January 2009.

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MOU Signing Between IHIS and HSEU



HSEU and the Integrated Health Information Systems (IHIS) Pte Ltd inked a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on 1 April 2009.

The signing signifies the move by both the Union and IHIS to harmonise the terms for IHIS staff based on two existing collective agreements covering the restructured healthcare institutions in Singapore.

This new entity is a consolidated one combining all the restructured healthcare institutions' IT staff. The IT function of all restructured hospitals and public health institutions were merged in September 2008 and IHIS comprises of 500 employees; some of whom are already loyal HSEU members.

Neo Hock Bin

Nominated by Healthcare Services Employees' Union

Comrade Neo Hock Bin joined the Amalgamated Union of Public Employees (AUPE) as a young nurse in the 1960s, where his contributions led to him being elected to the Singapore General Hospital (SGH) branch committee.

He faced his biggest challenge as a unionist in 1989 when the restructuring of the healthcare industry resulted in the formation of Health Corporation of Singapore Staff Union (HCSSU). Putting his personal concerns aside, Comrade Neo exercised great care in communicating the options and implications of the restructuring to the affected members in order to help them come to a decision.

In recognition of his long-standing commitment and contributions, the National Trades

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Spurring Members' Children On at the HSEU Bursary Award 2008

Every child's education is important and those who need help must be given assistance to bring out every child's potential to the fullest.

The Union recognises this importance and that is why bursary grants were presented at the HSEU Bursary Award 2008, to encourage our members' children and highlight their academic excellence. HSEU, SingHealth and National Healthcare Group made generous contributions to support this bursary.

The Guest-of Honour (GOH) was Mr Lim Swee Say, NTUC Secretary-General and Minister, Prime Minister's Office.

During his speech, Mr Lim Swee Say mentioned that the Labour Movement will set up a U Care Fund to help needy and retrenched workers this year. He said that despite cost-cutting measures among many organisations, the Labour Movement and its unions, social enterprises and partners will work closely to raise \$20 million for the new U Care Fund by the first half of this year, as compared to \$13 million and \$7 million raised in 2008 and 2007 respectively for Care and Share purposes.

The GOH also shared that the

U Care Fund could be used to help needy families cope with expenses like utilities and education, and assist retrenched workers who may not get any retrenchment benefits when their companies folded up.



"The bursary grants are a joint commitment between HSEU, SingHealth and National Healthcare Group to encourage children of our union members to excel in their studies. This year, we have done well to serve and help more members by increasing the number of awards from about 440 in 2007 to 530 in 2008," said HSEU Welfare Subcommittee Chairperson, Madam Choo Hin Chan.




Gold Collar Outreach
