It has also been a fun ride with our members in 2012. #### Healthcare Workers to See Increase in Base Pay

Some 16,000 public healthcare administrative, ancillary and support staff are set to see a salary increase of between 4 and 10% in their base pay starting this month after a review by the Ministry of Health and healthcare clusters.

The announcement was made at the launch of the Healthcare Cluster Tripartite Workgroup at the Khoo Teck Puat Hospital on 14 September 2012. The workgroup



comprises tripartite partners Ministry of Health (MOH), NTUC's healthcare cluster of unions and six other public healthcare clusters.

In its drive towards progressive wage through a Progressive Wage Model, the Tripartite Workgroup has also set its sight on helping at least 2,000 Healthcare workers in healthcare support, admin and ancillary jobs who currently earn \$1,700 and below to increase their base salaries between 10 and 20% from 2012 to end 2014.

As we usher in another year of renewed hopes, dreams and aspirations, let us pause for a moment to reflect on the events and episodic incidences that took place over the past year, let us reminisce the colourful moments of friendship and bonds that we cherish.

Healthcare Services Employees' Union is an integral part of the Labour Movement representing close to 30,000 union members from the healthcare sector. Though we had a good year in 2012, we must not take the industrial peace and harmony in our institutions for granted and neither should we assume that the good and stable Labour Management Relations could sustain forever by default. It takes lots of relationship building, regular engagement and bonding and the Union is relentlessly working towards achieving an all inclusive Union representing the interests of all workers regardless of collars, ages and nationalities.

In recent years, the Union has represented members in their workplace issues on average five cases a month. On a positive note we have more regular engagement and negotiation with Management to secure a competitive salary, terms and benefits, as well as to gain fair recognition and reward for our workers in terms of bonuses and annual increment. We have concluded the Collective Agreement (CA) for National University Hospital, which took effect in April 2012. We are in the midst of negotiating a new CA for the other healthcare clusters. In the coming years, we will work towards broadening the Union's scope of representation of the foreign workers on contract terms and the reemployed workers.

The Union hopes to further strengthen its partnership with Cluster Managements in further improving staff welfare, workplace safety and health. We encourage our members to strive for work life harmony with the support of the Management, induct better workplace integration for the good of the organisation and workers, and increase productivity with the tripartite healthcare cluster's various productivity initiatives with automation and mechanisation. Work towards greater representation for Professionals, Managers and Executives so as to be the voices of their concerns through advocacy.

Last but not least, on behalf of HSEU, I wish every union member and their families a fulfilling year ahead with good health and good employment. We thank you for your trust in us and applaud your continued membership with us.

#### Annual Increment Settlements for 2012

The following table illustrates the Al settlements that the Union had settled with the six public healthcare clusters for 2012. The Union is of the view that these have been a fair settlement and urge all healthcare staff to continue their good work towards higher productivity and bring the public healthcare clusters to greater heights.

In addition to raising productivity and wages, the Healthcare Cluster will work towards strengthening the Singaporean Core in the healthcare sector.

"Through these efforts, we hope to improve the skill levels, career prospects and wages of our healthcare workers as we work towards our shared goal of improving the quality, affordability and accessibility of our healthcare system for Singaporeans," said Minister for Health Gan Kim Yong.

He was joined by NTUC Secretary-General Lim Swee Say and Healthcare Cluster Tripartite Workgroup Co-chairperson and NTUC Healthcare Cluster Lead Patrick Tay at the launch.

Carrot Cake is probably Singaporean's favorite food. Crispy on the outside, moist


and soft inside, you just cannot stop eating once you start. It's so good that the \$2 portion is not even enough!
