Over 350 union leaders and branch officials, key stakeholders of NTUC social enterprises, strategic and industry partners, NTUC senior management and staff joined the Guest-of-Honour, Mr Lim Swee Say, NTUC Secretary-General and Mr John De Payva, NTUC President, for a night of celebrations and jubilation.

Mr Lim praised the unions and the NTUC Membership Department for their efforts in helping to increase union membership.

Merit Award

Highest Net Increase Award

HSEU emerged the Runner-up for the Highest Net Increase Award. This award recognises HSEU's efforts in achieving net increase of 2,383 members and 2,672 gross increases in membership. Secretary-General of NTUC, Mr Lim Swee Say, presented the \$4,000 cash award to Mr Mahmood Idrose, President of HSEU.

U Breakthrough Award

This award was presented to HSEU for its outstanding and innovative ways which allow the Union to achieve breakthroughs in areas such as recruitment, retention, quality (customer service, membership application process, etc.) and in its communication with members. Out of a total of 15 submissions, four unions were chosen by the Selection Committee. As the winning union, HSEU received a plaque and \$2,000 cash award.

Innovation and creativity are the hallmarks of the HSEU Membership campaigns. For example, this year, customised membership form and information kit were added to reinforce the union's identity and image as a Healthcare Industrial Union. WORDS FROM GENERAL SECRETARY

Dear Members,

You would have read on the front page that HSEU has won 3 awards for active efforts in recruiting new members. To achieve this, HSEU has applied the 3R (Recruitment, Retention and Relationships) strategy towards membership recruitment and retention and strengthen bonds amongst all members. Recruiting new members will always remain a top agenda of the union. However, union strength could not be maintained without the other 2 Rs, retention and relationship.

For the past months, HSEU has been organising a series of activities targeted at benefiting our union members as well as strengthening our relationships with our management partners. To date, more than 50 activities, of various scales and purposes, have been held successfully. Such mean feat cannot be achieved without the dedicated efforts of our branch leaders and officials, as well as support from the healthcare institutions. For example, we collaborated with other industrial unions to organise The Mahjong Challenge, which is designed to promote active aging and social interaction among senior members. For the more family-oriented, we have more than 300 members and their families participating in the National Day event to form the largest Singapore Human Flag at the Padang. As a result of improved communications as well as higher-quality union activities, we not only saw an increase in the participation of our existing members but also a sharp increase in new members. The good relationship between the union and management also helps HSEU in offering attractive benefits to recruit and retain members. As of now, our membership base has crossed the 13,000 members mark.

On the economic front, the 2008/2009 salary increment for SingHealth and NHG clusters that we negotiated remains relatively higher than before. However, in view of the uncertain economic conditions, we remain cautious on how the side effects of a slowing economy will eventually affect us in the near future. Going forward, the landscape for the healthcare sector remains bright as more hospitals will be built, while the recruitment for healthcare professionals is still ongoing. The Union is certain that Singapore's healthcare community, with its strong fundamentals and capable leadership, will ride out the uncertainties and emerge stronger like no other.

Branch Official Dialogue Delves Into Union's Progress and Changes



More than 60 HSEU officials representing various healthcare institutions attended the HSEU Branch Official Dialogue on 8 October 2008. The dialogue was held for the purpose of communicating the current progress and changes experienced by

the Union since the beginning of 2008. In his opening address, Mr Mahmood Idrose, President of HSEU, shared on the uncertainty of today's economic climate and noted that the healthcare community has always prevailed in times of uncertainty.

Mr Simon Ong, General Treasurer of HSEU, presented several key changes to the Union's financial guidelines based on suggestions and feedback from union officials. General Secretary, Ms Diana Chia, presented the interim updates of the progress by various sub-committees. She revealed constant improvements in areas of Industrial Relations, Membership Recruitment, Welfare, Youth and Sports.

Recently, NTUC, Ministry of Manpower and the Singapore National Employers Federation have come together to review the Employment Act. Several amendments were proposed. In addition to that, the Government has also announced some exciting changes to the Marriage and Parenthood package which will affect many members. To help the branch officials understand and explain such changes to members, Ms Thanaletchmi, Vice-President of HSEU, was invited to provide an overview of the changes from the healthcare perspective. Lastly, a panel comprising of HSEU Exco leaders engaged the branch officials in a frank and engaging session of Q & A.

Newly-elected Branch Officials completed IR course

The HSEU Basic Certificate in Industrial Relations (BCIR) Course concluded successfully on 30 August 2008 at Downtown East. Branch officials who attended this course acquire working knowledge and skills for the benefit of the union and its members.

This year, HSEU introduced a one-night residential component to this programme to provide more space and time for enhancing bonds with fellow unionists and senior NTUC leaders. The participants enjoyed a meaningful fire-side chat with HSEU President Mahmood and General Secretary Ms Diana Chia, where the senior union leaders shared on their journey and experiences as a unionist.

Extension of Medical Benefits

HSEU and its management partners, SingHealth, National Healthcare Group (NHG) and National University Hospital(NUH) take great pleasure in announcing that with effect from 1 October 2008, medical benefits for their respective employees will be extended to all the government restructured and specialist centres.

Prior to this, staff from respective healthcare providers and their dependents can use their medical benefits only when they seek specialist outpatient consultation (SOC) and hospitalisation at their respective employer institutions and specialist centres. With this extension, for staff on co-payment scheme, the same co-payment rates (10% for self and 30% for dependents) apply as long as they obtain treatment from government restructured hospitals and specialist centres. The cap for all claims under SOC and hospitalisation remains unchanged.

Please note that when staff and their dependents seek SOC treatment at the hospital / clinic outside of their employers, the staff / dependents must pay for the bill first and submit the receipt to their respective Human Resource Department to seek reimbursement. Both HSEU and its management partners will continue to work towards improving the staff benefits and welfare.

Maternity leave will be extended from 12 to 16 weeks for all Singaporean births (where child is a Singapore citizen) on or after 17 August 2008. Staff must have worked for her employer for a continuous duration of at least 90 calendar days before the birth of her child. Employers are encouraged to grant the extended Maternity leave from 17 August 2008 and will be required to do so upon Legislation.

From 17 August 2008, paid childcare leave will be extended from two to six days per year for working parents with any Singaporean child under the age of seven, regardless of the number of qualifying children. The first three days will be employer-paid and the last three days government-paid (capped at \$500 per day including CPF contributions).

From 17 August 2008, a working parent will be able to have six days of unpaid infant care leave if he or she has a Singaporean child under the age of two, regardless of the number of qualifying children.

The Government will reimburse the employer up to four weeks of salary, capped at \$10,000 (including CPF contributions), if they grant the mother the leave. The Government will reimburse the mother directly if she is selfemployed. A mother may take the four weeks of Adoption Leave flexibly or in a continuous block within a period of six months from the date of birth of the adopted child.

KidzQuest Programme, organised by Young NTUC, is a project that aims to inculcate a community service culture in young members by providing them with an opportunity for volunteerism.



U Stretch Vouchers Distributed to Help Lower Income Members Cope with Rising Cost of Living



In May 2008, NTUC started giving out "U-Stretch" vouchers for lower income union members to combat the effects of rising cost of living. The vouchers came in the form of 5% discount for every \$10 spent at NTUC co-ops and have a total value of \$50.

The objective of the U-Stretch discount voucher is to help mitigate the rising cost of food and inflation. Though it is not the same as cash vouchers, the discount vouchers will definitely help to reduce costs when workers do their shopping and marketing at Fairprice outlets and other NTUC Social enterprises e.g. NTUC Childcare, NTUC Club, NTUC Eldercare, NTUC Healthcare

and NTUC Link.

Many members gave feedback that the discount was not substantial enough and that they will need to spend about \$1,000 within 8 months in order to utilise all the youchers.

With this feedback, NTUC revised the usage terms of the vouchers and since 1 August 2008, U-Stretch recipients were able to use up to 4 coupons for every \$10 spending which equates to a 20% discount for a \$10 purchase!

HSEU spared no effort in publicising this to our members and in encouraging them to apply for the vouchers. With this strong outreach and increase in savings, many members came forward to apply for the vouchers and have expressed their gratitude to NTUC and HSEU for enabling them to reduce their costs substantially.

Through HSEU and the hard work of the Welfare Committee members, 1,168 members have saved a total of \$58,400 within 6 months!

Membership Milestone Celebration

The Membership Milestone Celebration was held at East Coast Park on 15 August 2008. This is in recognition of HSEU's recruitment crossing the half-way mark of 1300, towards the target of 2500 new members. This event

identified the contributions of individuals who have done much to increase the membership base of HSEU. Altogether, more than 30 participants including active Certified Recruiters, EXCO leaders as well as branch officials were invited for this event.
