Ahmad Shufi Jasmani always supports and guides his mentees to hone their skills in a clinical environment. His close observations and interactions with the junior nurses greatly impacted their professional growth and understanding of the various clinical practices.

Brother Shufi has been part of the Labour Movement since 2012 as a branch committee member. He progressed to the position of branch secretary in 2015 and was elected as a member of the executive council of the Healthcare Services Employees' Union (HSEU) in 2018. Brother Shufi participated in bonus meetings to raise workers' concerns about wages and the rising cost of living. He is also an approachable individual in the National Skin Centre (NSC). Union members often approach him on concerns regarding remunerations.

On top of being an active branch committee member, Brother Shufi is also involved as a committee member in the Dermatology Nurses Chapter (DNC) under Singapore Nurses Association. During the COVID-19 period, when physical meet-up was restricted, he worked closely with the DNC team to provide members with an online training alternative, allowing staff to attend renowned training from the US Dermatology team in their free time and during work. The training has greatly increased the productivity of the department by reducing the need for training leave and, at the same time, upskilling fellow nurses to prepare for the challenging healthcare landscape.

Brother Shufi dedicated his time to addressing issues of branch members and often lent a listening ear in his own time to his colleagues. He also shows compassion and caring toward colleagues who have fallen ill and are on extended hospitalisation leave, and he came down to visit them to follow up on their well-being.
