SRCEU engaged a trainer from Ong Teng Cheong Institute, to train the members on negotiation, leadership and team-spirit building.









The making of *Gula Melaka*

The coconuts we see in the market or supermarket of Singapore are totally without any husk.


It was certainly an eye-opener for our members to see the professionals husk a coconut within seconds. Having tried it for themselves, they realised this was no easy task.


