George LEONG Music Composer, Arranger, Producer, Sound Engineer & DJ



George Leong's musical career in the entertainment industry began at an early age. From 1987, he arranged songs from the Xin Yao movement 新语 〈songs composed and sung by Singaporeans), and theme songs used for Singapore Broadcasting Corporation's television dramas.

In 1992, Rock Records 波石 早島片 signed him up for an eight-year stint in Taiwan. He worked with artistes, such as Tracy Hwang 黄鶯鶯, Sarah Chen, 陳淑福, Sandy Lam 林德莲, Alex To 社德偉, Whinnie Shin 辛辣琪, Sammi Cheng 繁秀文, Karen Mok 真文辭, Energy, Fish Leong 梁靜苑, Jonathan Lee 李宗盛, Emil Chau 周華健, Richie Ren 任賢 斧, Pauline Lan 查心谱, Coco Lee 李文, Johnny Chen 小蟲, Mayday 五月天, Michael & Victor 無印良品 and the late Leslie Cheung 張蹈美 and Anita Mui 梅丝芳. One of his most notable music arrangements is 【追】, the title track for the movie 【全枝玉叶】 performed by Leslie Cheung 張蹈樂•

He composed Fish Leong and Mayday's【彩虹】, Coco Lee's【考复降器】, AlexTo's【爱你爱的不寻常】and Energy's【永远不说再见】一these earned him multiple platinum records.

He was musical director for AlexTo's concert at the Taipei Stadium in 1993 and also arranged a number of songs for AMei 張喜姝, JJ Lin's 林俊健, David Tao's 陶諧 and LeeHom Wang 王力宏's concert tours. He has produced dance remixes for artistes, such as 熹依林, 罗志祥, 張喜姝, 褒依林, 何维健 and 遥重, He was musical director, arranger and keyboardist for Wallace Chung 钟汉良's 【乐作人生】 concert in Shanghai in February 2016.

George is best known for his meticulous music arrangement and production work. He has recorded with top session musicians and orchestras in Los Angeles, Canada and China, arranging theme songs for films such as 【紅玫瑰白玫 瑰】, 【金枝玉叶】, 【袯甲歌声】, 【神雅侠侣】 and 【培戀桃花游】. Significantly, his arrangement of the theme song for the movie 【白髮尾文】, 【紅旗白髮】 even won the Best Movie Theme Song in the 30th Golden Horse Awards. He has also worked with celebrated TV director 播侃侃 on theme songs for 【新龍門客枝】, 【倚天眉龍記】 and 【今生今世】.

He was presented the "Artistic Excellence" Award in 2016 and the "Top Local Soundtrack" in 2013 by the Composers and Authors Society of Singapore (COMPASS).

As a disk-jockey (DJ) George Leong's portfolio includes stints at all iconic clubbing establishments - Avalon, Centro, Lola, Attica, Zouk and St James Powerstation. He has also been invited to play in clubs in most Asian metropolitan cities, such as Bangkok, Beijing, Kuala Lumpur, Manila, Shanghai and Taipei. His was the name behind the wildly successful 'Fabulous Sundays' and 'Superstar' events. In 2004, he played to crowds of 8000 partygoers at Nation.04. He also played for official and national street party events, including the Chingay Street Festival, the Singapore National Day Parade in 2008, and the Mediacorp countdown party 'Celebrate 2010' at the Marina Bay. The New Paper's Mardi Gras birthday bash in 2013 also featured him on the decks.

In 2016 June, He worked with LeeHom Wang 至力宏 to arrange and remix music for 盖世英雄, the first EDM remix TV show contest in China.

George Leong represented Singapore as regional judge for the 2016 HK Asia-Pop Music Festival in Hong Kong, He served as judge and music director of the 2nd Season Sing! China Singapore Selections Singing Competition.
