Under Brother Benjamin's adept leadership, the NTUC U-Care Fund disbursed a remarkable \$3 million annually, benefitting approximately 10,000 lower-income union members and their families. His influence also reached key councils and committees, including the Industrial Relations Council, Membership Council, Training Council, International Relations Committee, and the Audit, Risk, and Governance Committee.
