Professionally, Brother Alan is a strong advocate for continuous learning and innovation in his Compliance and Quality Improvement role. He has spearheaded centre-wide quality projects, revamped the NSC intranet portal, and ensured compliance with the Healthcare Services Act. Additionally, he played a key role as secretariat for the 25th World Congress of Dermatology 2023, a prestigious global event attended by over 12,000 delegates—demonstrating his ability to manage complex and high-profile responsibilities.
